## Towards An Inclusive STEAM Programme For ALL

### Project progress

As of now, the project has finished its implementation phase in elementary and secondary schools, and its partners are preparing for the Learning Teacher Training activity that will take place in Greece in October. In parallel, the consortium is working on producing a comprehensive Guide for Educators to support the organisation and delivery of inclusive STEAM practices in the classroom.

### Learning Teaching Training Activity, Greece

Doukas School hosted the training activity at its premises in Athens with great success. Fifteen primary and secondary-level teachers and staff members participated in the training, which included meaningful discussions and hands-on activities.

The main focus of the training was knowledge sharing as a reflective process of the implementations in each partner country, as well as feedback rounds on the material developed.

Also, in preparation for the Educators' Guide, participants elaborated on inclusive practices in STEAM.



### What's next?

The STEAM4ALL project is stepping into its final stage.

The University of Groningen, along with the partners' contribution, aims to finalise the Guide for Educators and test it with teachers, STEAM experts, and people with inclusive backgrounds.

The Guide will be made available on the e-learning platform for easy access.
